




HOW IS TRANSPORTATION FUNDED IN TENNESSEE'S STATE BUDGET? ---







THE RATIO OF FEDERAL REVENUES TO STATE FUNDS OVER TIME ...



For every \$1.00 in federal revenues in the Highway Fund, \$0.95 is contributed from state gas and fuel taxes, motor vehicle registrations, and other state revenue sources.

TRENDS ····

Due to **inflation**, each 20c tax on a gallon of gas buys about half as much infrastructure construction as when the rate went into effect in 1989.



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The **average fuel efficiency** of new cars, trucks, and SUVs manufactured for sale in the U.S. has improved over the years.



A WORD OF CAUTION

The data presented here only account for transportation funding that is in the state budget. They do not include any transportation spending that is done directly by the federal government or by local governments with their own revenues – including federal spending that flows through local governments.
