The accompanying policy brief, however, uses a more recent statewide estimate of 22% developed by the USDA in 2016. Comparable county-level estimates for 2016 are not available.

<sup>2</sup> The United States Medicaid enrollment percentage represents enrollment in non-expansion states as reported to HHS in January 2016 as a percent of 2016 population estimates. States include AL, FL, GA, ID, KS, LA, ME, MS, MO, NE, NC, OK, SC, SD, TN, TX, UT, VA, WI, and WY.

<sup>3</sup> Represents premiums for the 2nd lowest cost Silver plan (also known as the "benchmark plan") for a 27-year old non-tobacco user. Does not include the impact of any premium subsidies for which individuals may be eligible.
